



On Wednesday, January 7, the City of Malibu hosted Palisades Fire Remembrance: Finding Strength in Community at City Hall, marking one year since the Palisades Fire. The gathering honored the lives lost, families displaced, neighborhoods destroyed, and the resilience that emerged from Malibu's greatest disaster.

Community members came together to reflect and support one another. The program featured a moment of silence, performances by the Senior Center Choir, a poem by Malibu Poet Laureate Charlotte Ward, and a crocheted art tribute created by Councilmember Haylynn Conrad and the Senior Center knitting group, which remains on display at the lower entrance to City Hall. Remarks were shared by Mayor Marianne Riggins, Senator Ben Allen, Assemblymember Jacqui Irwin, LA County Supervisor Lindsey Horvath, LA County Sheriff Robert Luna, and LA County Assistant Fire Chief Drew Smith.
